SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- Vision, Continuous Improvement and Focus of District Work
 - ♦ COVID Update
 - Active cases
 - Notes of Interest New Ohio Department of Health Guidance discontinues universal contract tracing and notification of exposure by schools effective immediately due to it being "impractical" with the spread of Omicron.
- Communication and Collaboration
 - Congratulations to teachers Amy Beanblossom and Christen Cyphers who each received \$450 from the Darke County Foundation and the Ruth Elaine Furlong Fund after submitting proposals for use in the classroom. Amy teachers the MH classroom and will use the grant to purchase sensory items for her students. Christen, a HS ELA teacher, will use the grant to purchase a sitto-stand desk for students to use in her classroom.
 - ♦ Congratulations to our JH boys and girls basketball teams. The 7th grade girls team finished the regular season undefeated and the #1 seed in the WOAC tournament. The 8th grade girls finished at 11-5 and the #4 seed. The 7th grade boys finished at 13-3 and enter the tournament as the #2 seed, and the 8th grade boys will be the #3 seed after a 12-4 regular season.
- Policies and Governance
 - Policy JEFB Released Time for Religious Instruction (DRAFT REVIEW): This would be a new policy, which would allow for Lifewise Academy to provide the instruction. Please see a draft of the policy included in this week's notes. I used the sample from OSBA, but made some changes to address the liability piece we have discussed. I sent the copy to our attorney for his review also.

- ◆ 1st Semester Confirmed Bullying Cases. As required by law, the district must report to the Board of Education and then post on our website, the number of confirmed bullying cases at each building per semester. There are always cases that principals investigate for alleged bullying that don't meet the definition outlined in our board policy and student handbooks. In some of those cases, there is discipline for name calling or wrong doing that aren't defined as bullying. These are cases in which the principals determined bullying was involved that included disciplinary action.

Instruction

- ◆ Conferences for EL/MS will be held February 10.
- ◆ HB 110 and College Credit Plus Requires ODE and the Department of Higher Education to jointly develop and post a permission slip for parents to sign that indicates "the potential for mature subject matter in a course taken through CCP". Mature subject matter is "any course subject matter or material of a graphic, explicit, violent, or sexual nature." This has come about recently as an issue because of complaints from parents about the use of resources or subjects discussed in college classes. Because it is the college's resources, public schools do not control or have the say in what is used in those classes. The information is posted on Sinclair's website for "CCP Parent Information".

Resources

- ♦ ODE School Bus Purchase Program The district is eligible to receive funds in the amount of \$135,000 to purchase and replace 3 buses. The buses qualify due to the age and mileage of the buses. Please note that an average bus costs around \$85,000 and we get \$45,000 towards the purchase of each bus (we can take the \$135K and buy two for example). We need to decide on how many buses and submit the paperwork by June 30, 2022. We have until the end of 2023 to use the funds to purchase any buses. I'll provide you all with copies of a spreadsheet that has our fleet with current mileage for consideration.
- ◆ Traffic Lights Project The BOE would need to pass a resolution committing to pay ½ the cost of the design and engineering cost estimated to be around \$65,000 total.

 - All MS students recently completed the winter STAR assessments in math and English. Data received from these assessments will provide staff with valuable information regarding student progress and learning needs and will assist staff in planning meaningful and intentional lessons.
 - The MS staff continues to work hard in preparation for upcoming state testing. The staff has collaborated during monthly grade level meetings and quarterly department meetings in order to better streamline communication and identify individual student needs. Testing groups are being formulated and staff is working hard to ensure that

every student is provided instruction based on their individual needs. Testing dates: ELA – March 29-30; Math (5th and 8th only) – April 5-6; Science (5th and 8th only) – April 11-12.
