Continuous Improvement and Vision

School Operations, Resources, and Learning Environment

> Collaboration

- A huge thank you to April Hoying, Joni Pechie, and Jason Stephan for assisting in organizing our October 11 PD day. The day centered on value added data, STAR reports, and creating and implementing higher level thinking.
- On October 20, MS staff met in departments and focused on various topics. Our ELA department discussed scheduling and class structures, our math department focused on developing strategies to assist in filling student learning gaps, and our science and social studies departments discussed various subject related resources and lesson delivery strategies.
- On October 20, April Hoying held an OTES 2.0 implementation luncheon at the ESC for Darke County administrators. During this meeting, principals from various buildings and various levels met to discuss how their district was implementing the new teacher evaluation process in their districts.

Parents and Community Engagement

We have about 25 students connected in the program which will meet on Tuesdays after school in the library.

High School

- Principals support the implementation of high-quality standards based instruction that results in higher levels of achievement for all students.

 - ♦ In October, Mrs. Kessler and I met to review seniors not on track to graduate. During November, we will meet with these students to ensure that they have a plan to graduate.
