- > Student Achievement, Accomplishments, and News

 - On Friday, November 5, students and staff participated in our Quarter 1 assembly. This year saw the return of Tanya Crevier and her Enthusiasm Experiences. In addition, individual students were recognized as Q1 Growth Mindset winners. We also recognized outstanding fall athletic achievements and various clubs.
- Instruction
 - The week of November 7 was designated, "Military Week" at A-B MS. Students learned about various branches of our military each day and on November 9, A-B MS students had the opportunity to learn more about our nation's history and write thank you letters to current and past service men and women. We had a vehicle, virtual reality simulations, uniforms dating back to the French and Indian War, battle equipment, literature, and food.
 - On Tuesday, November 15, all 6th grade students were presented with a "Survival Guide" presentation. The goal of this presentation was to assist students with items such as study tips, time management skills, organization, and general school tips. Thank you to Ashley Matheson and our 6th grade teachers for assisting with this program.
 - Currently, our Math Department is using a free trial of a math program called Get More Math. Teachers are seeing solid results from the program and have reported that math fact retention has increased. Mr. Lecklider created a 500 Point Club for our 6th graders in hopes of sparking interest. Congrats to Avery Kniesly, Ashley Stephens, Joey Marshall, and Simon Brown for making the Club!
- School Operations, Resources, and Learning Environment
 - Arcanum-Butler Local held our monthly fire drill on Tuesday, November 29. We were able to successfully evacuate the entire building in just over two minutes during this unannounced drill.
 - I would like to once again thank the A-B PTO for their continued support of A-B MS. The PTO has been instrumental in allowing us to continue using the Trojan Way Store which is a major component of the MS PBIS program.
 - 270 MS students earned the Q1 Reward which was a movie and popcorn on November 22. Students earned this reward for having no D's/F's on their Q1 report card, no missing assignments, and no office referral during the first quarter of school. 270 students represent 87% of our student body.

- During November, several MS teachers participated in "A Season of Thanks". For this event staff brought in a pumpkin and, on each Monday in November, students wrote one thing they were thankful for on the pumpkin. Thanks to all who participated.
- Collaboration
 - The District DLT meeting was held on Wednesday, November 30. During the meeting, Superintendent John Stephens provided members with a district update and building levels met to update and share building CIP progress.
 - During MS Quarterly Department Meetings, staff worked together focusing on the following items: ELA – Vocabulary support; Math – Get More Math Usage; Science – Lab ideas; Social Studies – Resource Sharing; and SPED – Supporting Student Needs/Scheduling.
 - During MS Quarterly Grade Level Meetings, staff worked together to progress monitor our tier 1, 2, and 3 intervention students. This time is critically important for coordinating student academic and behavior support.
 - I would like to thank Jason Stephan, Beth Kessler, and Ashley Matheson for actively participating in our 2023-2024 scheduling meeting. November 14 was our second meeting as we attempt to ensure that scheduling goes as smoothly as possible in the spring and that students will have the ability to take all the courses of their choice.
- > Parents and Community Engagement
 - Parent-Teacher conferences were held on Tuesday, November 8, and Thursday, November 10. I would like to thank the staff, parents, and students for their attendance and collaboration.
