SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- Vision, Continuous Improvement and Focus of District Work
 - ♦ We will have a District Leadership Team meeting in June to wrap up the year and begin the goal planning process for 2021-2022.
 - COVID Update
- Communication and Collaboration
 - Athletics
 - OHSAA will be charging member schools dues next year. We will be charged \$50 for each varsity sport (boys and girls separately). That totals \$800 for us.
 - Football playoffs expanded
 - Spring Tournaments & Meets

- Policies and Governance
 - ♦ The free lunch program has been extended for all of next school year. Staffing proposal from Jordan Greve.
 - Policies for May vote:
 - BCFA Business Advisory Council Board: Provides flexibility for districts to use MVCTC's council if we would choose. Right now, Mike Gray and the ESC runs our council.
 - CBC Superintendent's Contract: Law has allowed for the superintendent to cash in vacation days, so this is now added to school policy (as long as it is written in the Supt Contract). I am permitted to cash in up to ten unused vacation days.
 - EBC Emergency Management Safety Plans: Includes the new requirement of the formation of threat assessment teams, effective in 2022-2023.
 - GA Personnel Policies Goals: Adds the term *registered* for employees in addition to licensed and certified. *Registered* employees are those from the following fields who have a license in their field, but not in education. Essentially, they don't have to go through the whole licensure procedures to work in schools. Speech pathologists, audiologists, registered nurses, physical therapists, occupational therapists, and social workers.
 - IGCG Preschool Program: Any new preschool employee must go through tuberculosis screening.
 - DJH Credit Cards: Makes the Superintendent the "compliance officer". While Kip manages the signing in and out of cards, it will be my responsibility to sign off on purchases. We were already doing it that way, but the audit wanted language changes

because Jeff keeps a card all year and doesn't sign it out and back in. I review his purchases monthly.

♦ Calamity Days Update – Language for approval of reduced hours for the school year due to the two additional calamity days.

 - ◆ During the recent two hour early release, teachers met to discuss the 4th quarter Journey's reading series materials and collaborated with grade levels to focus on writing and other content area gaps they continue to see as the year comes to an end.
 - ◆ I am excited to announce that Renee Dyke will be the Intervention and Recovery Coach for the 2021-2022 school year. Her position will be paid with ESSER funds to provide intensive reading interventions for low income students.
 - ♦ The elementary teaching team is complete! Miss Courtney McEldowney, Miss Stevie Johnting, and Mr. Jesse Warner will be joining the elementary staff for the 2021-2022 school year.

➤ Instruction (CIP Goal #2)
