PRINCIPAL'S REPORTS:

- Elementary
 - Continuous Improvement and Vision (CIP Goal #1)
 - ◆ Students and teachers have been working extremely hard preparing for the state assessments. The 3rd and 4th grade students will be taking the tests the middle of April. The 2nd grade students just completed the IOWA/CogAT assessments, which will identify students as gifted in specific areas.
 - ➤ Instruction (CIP Goal #2)
 - Thank you to all the teachers and the parent volunteers for a successful kindergarten screening for the incoming Class of 2036. Over 80 students are expected to attend kindergarten this fall. The teachers will use this student data to plan for the upcoming school year.
