- Vision, Continuous Improvement and Focus of District Work
 - ♦ Summer School plans
 - ♦ COVID Update
- Communication and Collaboration
 - ♦ County EMA officials were at school to monitor a tornado drill. Students, staff, and administrators did an excellent job during the drill. Thank you to the principals for organizing and running the drill.
- Policies and Governance
 - Fair School Funding Update
 - Policies for May vote
 - BCFA Business Advisory Council Board: Provides flexibility for districts to use MVCTC's council if we would choose. Right now, Mike Gray and the ESC runs our council.
 - CBC Superintendent's Contract: Law has allowed for the superintendent to cash in vacation days, so this is now added to school policy (as long as it is written in the Supt Contract). I am permitted to cash in up to ten unused vacation days.

- EBC Emergency Management Safety Plans: Includes the new requirement of the formation of threat assessment teams, effective in 2022-2023.
- GA Personnel Policies Goals: Adds the term registered for employees in addition to licensed and certified. Registered employees are those from the following fields who have a license in their field, but not in education. Essentially, they don't have to go through the whole licensure procedures to work in schools. Speech pathologists, audiologists, registered nurses, physical therapists, occupational therapists, and social workers.
- IGCG Preschool Program: Any new preschool employee must go through tuberculosis screening.
- DJH Credit Cards: Makes the Superintendent the "compliance officer". While Kip manages the signing in and out of cards, it will be my responsibility to sign off on purchases. We were already doing it that way, but the audit wanted language changes because Jeff keeps a card all year and doesn't sign it out and back in. I review his purchases monthly.
- Calamity Days Update Language for approval of reduced hours for the school year due to the two additional calamity days.

Instruction

- ◆ I will be working on the Principals and Athletic Director evaluations.
- ♦ State testing season is here! We have several days in the next 4-5 weeks. The HS will have an alternate schedule for several days with students not testing coming in on a delayed schedule.

Resources

♦ Capital Improvements – The sub-committee will meet before the May board meeting because by then we will have more accurate numbers from the five-year forecast.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORTS:

Elementary

- Continuous Improvement and Vision (CIP Goal #1)
 - ◆ Students and teachers have been working extremely hard preparing for the state assessments. The 3rd and 4th grade students will complete the ELA and math tests in mid-April. The 2nd grade students will be taking the IOWA/CogAT assessments, which will identify students as gifted in specific areas.
 - ♦ Thank you to Jason Stephan for leading the staff through an OTES 2.0 overview and guiding teacher discussions on planning for the transition for the upcoming school year.
- ➤ Instruction (CIP Goal #2)
 - ♦ Thank you to all the kindergarten teachers, Terri Greve, Amy Byers, and the parent volunteers for a successful kindergarten screening for the incoming class of 2034. Over 75 students are expected to attend kindergarten this fall.
 - Erin Fout and the AELC students researched and explored the life cycle as they continue to watch their tadpole friends each day.
 - The 1st grade classrooms held their annual consumer day where students applied their knowledge of money to buy different objects (books, snacks, toys, etc) and counted and exchanged change.
 - Second grade students used their engineering skills to design and construct leprechaun traps for St. Patrick's Day.
 - ♦ Carol Bryson, Sarah Loxley, and Ann Glasscoe used the March Madness theme to motivate 3rd grade students to practice and prepare for the state assessments. Thank you to Abbey Moore for digging out old uniforms for the students to use.
 - ♦ The 4th grade teachers continue to use creative writing prompts integrated within subjects to boost writing and language skills.
 - ♦ All students celebrated the 100th day of in-person learning on March 5 by participating in 100 themed activities and also ending our reading celebration week with a guest reader appearance in each classroom.

Middle School

- Standard 1: Continuous Improvement Principals help create a shared vision and clear goals for their schools and ensure continuous progress toward achieving the goals.
 - ◆ Congratulations to our March Students of the Month: 5th grade Brynn Byers and Leland Neumaier; 6th grade Claire Hein and Gideon Garno; 7th grade Kamryn Beisner and Matthew McCans; 8th grade Shyenne Smith and Owen Netherly.
 - ◆ Congratulations to our March T-Shirt Tuesday winners: Alyssandra Abelquist helpfulness; Ashtyn Robinson – helpfulness; Nicki Messina – improvement; Eli Kincaid – effort; and Clark Lemons – academic.
 - ♦ Congratulations to 7th grader Meredith Laux and 8th grader Zoe DeHut for qualifying for the FCCLA State Competition with their *Journey Home* project for homeless veterans. Their project raised \$442.78 for the Journey Home which bought essential supplies such as food, toilet paper, clothing, and cleaning supplies for homeless military veterans.
- Standard 2: Instruction Principals support the implementation of high-quality standards-based instruction that results in higher levels of achievement for all students.
 - Fifth grade students have been spending time learning about topics such as speed, weight, and distance. Mrs. Dickman had students create paper airplanes of various weights and catapults which were used to launch various objects. Students then calculated distance and speed and made various conclusions based on the data they recorded.
 - ♦ Seventh graders recently completed a project-based learning activity on biomes. All 7th graders were assigned one of five biomes and used 2 liter bottles to create their biomes.
 - ◆ The Middle School Band had an outstanding solo & ensemble event on Tuesday, March 23. Students were able to give live performances to an OMEA certified judge and receive feedback on their performances. The 7th and 8th grade band students had a total of 18 performance events. Students performed extremely well and ended the night with both written feedback and ratings from the judge. The students put a lot of hard work into preparing these performances, with much of it being student-led learning. Of the 18 events, students earned 14 superior ratings and 4 excellent ratings! A very impressive showing.
- Standard 3: School Operations, Resources, and Learning Environment Principals allocate resources and manage school operations in order to ensure a safe and productive learning environment.
 - The Arcanum-Butler Local School District participated in a fire drill on Friday, March 12. During this drill, all staff and students successfully evacuated the building in 2:01:22 and no major or minor issues were reported.

- On Wednesday, March 24, the Arcanum-Butler Local School District participated in the first of three required tornado drills. A special thank you to Josh Haney and Chief Troutwine for taking the time to meet with the administrative team regarding the drill and for making recommendations on increasing the efficiency of future drills.
